This society is named as a tribute to Hartley and Ruth Barker, Emeritus Trustees, and to recognize living planned giving donors.

Hartley and Ruth knew each other since childhood and were married in 1950 in Wisconsin. They were introduced to the Clubs after moving to Arizona in 1971. Hartley became a board member of what was then the Girls Club. Having four daughters, he was passionate about providing youth development programming and opportunities for girls.

When the Boys Club and the Girls Club merged in 1992, Hartley was one of the few board members to accept a seat on the new merger that would be known as Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Scottsdale (BGCS).

In 1998, after the Barkers made their first sizable gift, BGCS opened the Hartley & Ruth Barker Branch in honor of their generous support. To this day, the Barker Branch remains one of the busiest and largest of the Branches in Scottsdale.

In 2002, Hartley served on the steering committee for the Clubs' capital campaign, and the couple made another sizable gift naming gymnasiums and teen centers after fellow supporters and leaders Jim Hill, Bruce MacDougall and Sal Cosenza.

After Hartley's passing in 2010, Ruth continued as an active member of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Scottsdale Auxiliary and as an Honorary Chair of the BGCS Board of Governors and Foundation Board of Trustees until she passed in 2013.

The Barker's lifetime of giving to the Boys & Girls Clubs of Greater Scottsdale to date is in excess of \$4.5 million. This number has since grown after the substantial endowment gift Hartley and Ruth made to the Foundation after their passing.
